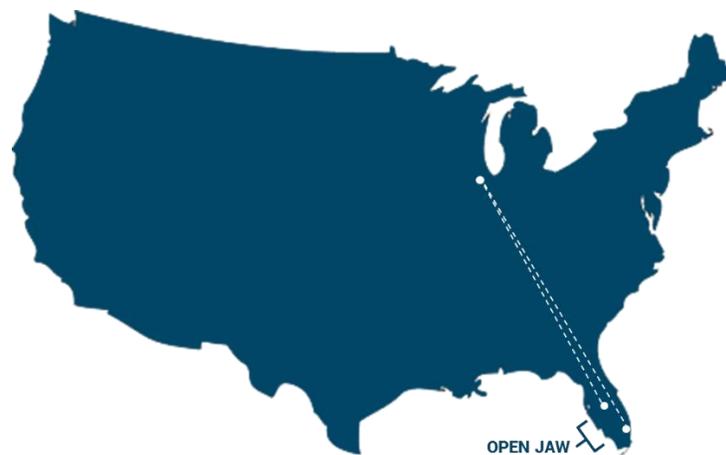


Building an Open Jaw Itinerary

An open jaw itinerary contains a flight in which the traveler does not arrive back to the same city of departure and/or does not depart from the same city where he/she first landed. The path lines between the airports form an open angle, rather than a closed loop, and the angle resembles an open jawline. The traveler will use some other transport to travel between the airports.



An Example Scenario

Your clients are interested in sightseeing around Florida where they depart from Chicago (ORD) and fly into Orlando (MCO). From there, they'll join a 2-day bus tour that will end with a 3-night stay in Miami (MIA). From MIA, they'll fly back home to ORD.

1. On [ALGVacations.com](https://www.algvacations.com) in the reservation tool, select **Multiple Destinations** to open the advanced booking page.
2. Complete the initial search fields, including the brand, destination region, number of rooms and travelers, and the origin city (in this case, ORD). You can also enter a promo code and select Travel Protection Plus if you choose.

3. For **Destination #1**, enter their destination (MCO) and select the number of nights needed from the drop-down list. In this example, our clients are catching a bus tour so they'll spend no (0) nights in MCO, but we'll enter 2 nights in the **# of Nights** field to accommodate the nights spent on the bus tour prior to arriving in Miami.

In this section, we'll also determine what travel components are required at this destination. You'll notice that **A flight is required to this destination** is grayed out and can't be deselected. The reservation tool recognizes that a flight is required between ORD and MCO so that selection is not changeable. Because our clients won't need a hotel or rental car in Orlando, we'll uncheck both of those options.

4. For **Destination #2**, enter the next destination where your travelers will arrive. In this case, MIA. Since they'll spend 3 nights here and because they're arriving by bus, uncheck that they need a flight to this destination. They won't need a rental car either, but they will need a hotel for 3 nights.

5. Optional: If additional destinations are needed, click **Add Additional Destination**. This will add another destination panel on the Search page.
6. The origin airport (in this case, ORD) will display by default in the **Going to** field of the **Return flight** panel. If your clients want to return to a different city, just select their preference from the drop-down list.
